The past year has been transformative for DFCCIL, with several significant milestones that have strengthened our infrastructure and operational capabilities:

- DFC Project has transitioned to operations phase with commissioning of more than 96% of total DFC network.
- We achieved our **HIGHEST EVER INTERCHANGE on March 30, 2025**, with DFC handling 848 trains (surpassing our previous best of 799 on January 22, 2025).
- A major milestone was achieved with the inauguration of our new DFCCIL Corporate Office at Noida on February 3, 2025. This state-of-the-art building stands as an iconic structure and provides us with a world-class working environment.
- Commissioning of the New Rewari Chord Line stretching 1.22 km on July 14, 2024 has eliminated the need for loco reversal at New Rewari.
- Track linking work in the Vaitarna-JNPT section of WDFC has picked up and 129 kms of track linking has been completed.
- We commissioned New Bhaupur and New Gothangam GCTs. Award of a new GCTs at New DaudKhan station and New Sakhun station demonstrates our commitment to enhancing logistics infrastructure.
- An Innovation Cell is set up in Corporate office to promote and support innovative ideas in the organization.
- We signed a significant MOU with DMIC IIT GNL on October 29, 2024, for the construction of MMLH from New Dadri station of WDFC, paving the way for enhanced multi-modal logistics capabilities.
- On strategic collaboration front, our Center for Heavy Haul Rail Research & Development (CHHRRD) entered the MOUs with IIT-Roorkee and Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya, fostering innovation and research that will elevate excellence in the freight transportation and logistics sector.
- Through our collaborative efforts, we planted 20,000 saplings during the monsoon season at New Udhna and New Bhestan stations in the New Makarpura Sachin Section of WDFC, reinforcing our commitment to environmental sustainability and green initiatives.

As we move forward into the new financial year, I am confident that DFCCIL will continue its upward trajectory, setting new benchmarks in freight transportation. Our collective vision and determined efforts will drive us toward achieving even greater milestones in FY 2025-26. Some of the important targets for the new year are listed below:
