DFCCIL Signs 3 Contracts worth Rs. 1063 crore for Special Steel Bridges for Western DFC

Dedicated Freight Corridor Corporation of India Ltd. (DFCCIL) has signed 3 Contract agreements worth Rs. 1063 crore for the construction of 9 Special Steel Bridges spanning over various important rivers like Narmada, Damanganga, Ulhas, Par, Tapi, Yamuna & Hindon water main, creeks and 3nos. of Rail Flyovers at Surat, Mumbai, Vadodara and Noida of Phase 2 of Western Dedicated Freight Corridor.

The contracts were signed between Dedicated Freight Corridor Corporation of India Ltd. and IIS-L&T Consortium (a consortium consisting of IHI from Japan & L&T from India). Adesh Sharma MD, M.K. Mittal, Director/Finance, D.S. Rana, Director/Infra. and other officials of DFCCIL along with various contractors' representatives were present.

DFCCIL, a special purpose vehicle (SPV) is engaged in planning, Construction, operation and maintance of the Dedicated Freight Corridors and in the first phase, the two corridors, namely Eastern Corridor from Ludhiana to Dankuni (1840 Kms) and the Western Corridor from Dadri to Jawahar Lal Nehru Port (JNPT) (1502 Kms) are being constructed. The Western Corridors is being funded by Japan International Corporation Agency (JICA), while the Eastern Corridor from Mughalsairai to Ludhiana is being funded by the World Bank.
